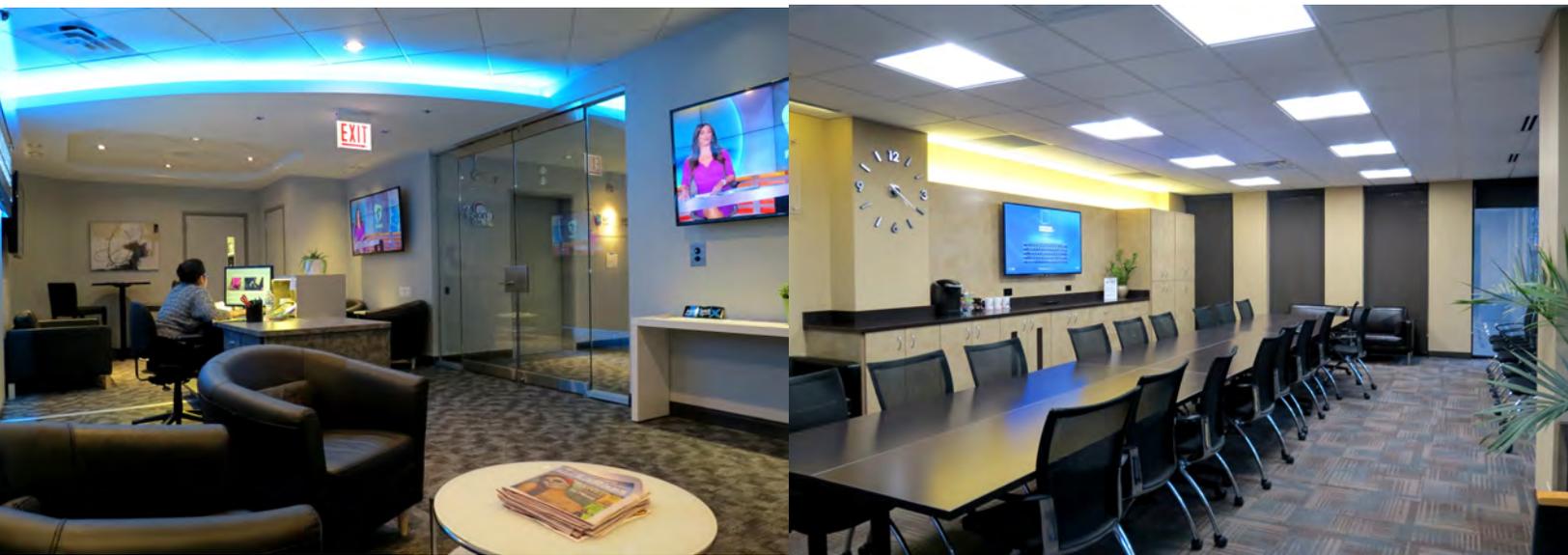


Modern Office Ideas & Examples

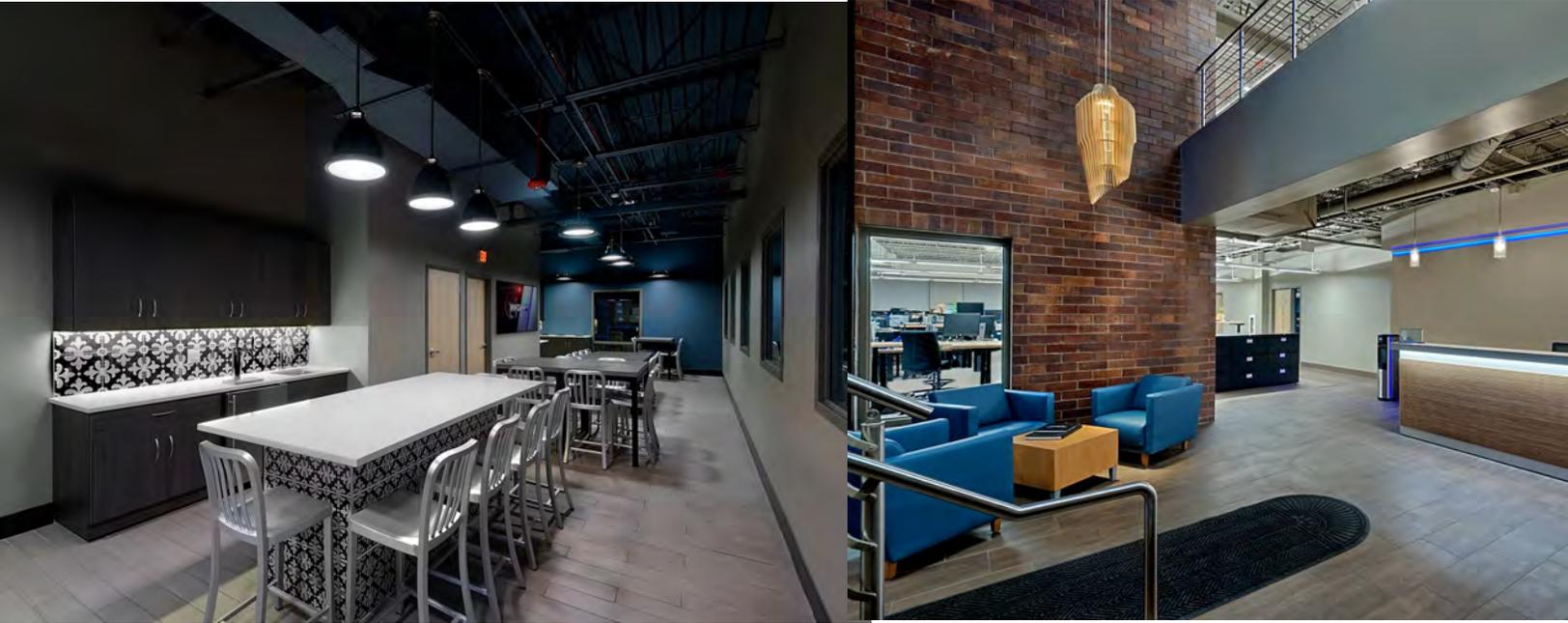
Compass

Incorporating Nature

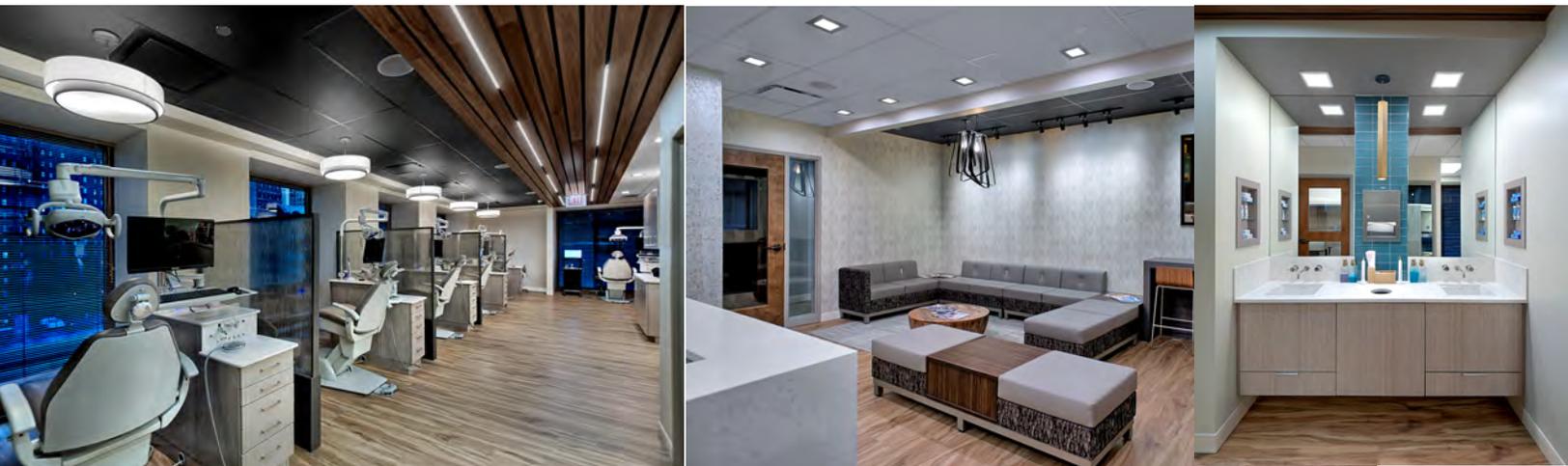
